PSC have recently been providing assistance to Power and Water Corporation (PWC) in Darwin NT Australia with Power System Operator Training for their AREVA 2.3 EMS SCADA system. PWC is unique in the Australian Power industry as they operate generation, transmission, retail distribution and also act as system operator. They also have the challenge of climatic changes of the wet season and a very diverse network covering a large area.

Transpower 3rd Party Data Infrastructure Project

PSC is pleased to assist Transpower New Zealand Limited with the successful completion of phase 1 of their 3rd Party Data Infrastructure project. Generators, lines companies and directly-connected customers (referred to as Third Parties) require real-time data on the status of the high voltage power grid to manage their networks and plant, and/or to comply with the Electricity Governance Rules.

Utilizing world class software from AREVA T&D of Redmond Washington USA and a small team of skilled and dedicated people, this project was recently completed. The team was lead by Ronnie Moon, Transpower MS&T Project Leader, and was staffed by Esther Li, Transpower RTS Operational Analyst and Jack Homeyer, PSC SCADA Engineer and software

designer. Additional staff from Transpower and PSC were called in as needed for their expertise.

PSC Assists Pacific Gas & Electric with a Historian Assessment and Data Reporting Development

Pacific Gas & Electric in San Francisco engaged PSC to perform an audit on its historian systems and make recommendations on how PG&E can make better use of its historical data through the development of automated reports and the use of alternative technologies. PSC also developed standard reports for operational staff so that they can more easily get data from their existing systems. This was a team effort with contributions from PSC's Andrew North based in Australia, Feiyu Lu based in San Francisco and Alex Boyd based in Seattle.

Andrew North performed an onsite survey of PG&E's existing historical systems and delivered a comprehensive report detailing the current state of the existing systems and

detailing options for improving historical data management. Andrew was able to use his significant historical systems expertise in developing the report. From the report Andrew and Alex Boyd were able to identify the benefits of various recommendations.

Feiyu Lu was responsible for the engineering component of the project. He worked with the PG&E operational staff to identify the data requirements. From those requirements he developed and implemented a number of key reports. Once the operations staff had an opportunity to use the reports Feiyu developed, they identified additional report development that would be useful to them. It just goes to show the power of information!
